



# **INLAND EMPIRE CRIME AND INTELLIGENCE ANALYSTS ASSOCIATION**

**General Meeting Minutes  
Thursday, April 23, 2009  
Highland Police Department  
9:15 am – 12:00 pm**

- I. Meeting brought to order at 9:15 am by President Sheila Harbert  
Sheila Harbert welcomed everyone and had everyone introduce themselves. Vice President – Programs Kim Folkens gave general housekeeping comments.
- II. Board Meeting Minutes  
Sheila Harbert reported to the members that the minutes from the Board Meeting held on February 25, 2009 were available on the back table. Sheila highlighted the topics of the Board Meeting (further details are listed under each of the individual reports).
- III. Treasurer's Report  
Michelle Smith read the treasurer's report and had copies of the report on the back table. Michelle explained the treasury statement balance as of the 4/22/09 was \$1,348.53, which included the bank statement balance of \$531.53, \$830.00 in association income and membership dues, and anticipated Association expenditures of \$725.00. The expenditures included the renewal of IACA dual membership (due 4/30/09) and the annual State Membership dues.
- IV. Membership Report  
Rebecca Gibson has sent out a current membership list via e-mail, along with the current membership application/renewal forms. No other membership report was given at this time.
- V. Programs Report  
Kim Folkens reported to the membership the training schedule discussed at the February 2009 Board Meeting. The training schedule was available on the back table. There was some discussion regarding a field trip to LAPD to observe a COMPSTAT meeting. A tentative date for this visit is Wednesday, August 12, 2009. Kim will contact LAPD to schedule our visit. There was also discussion regarding CMAP training in San Diego. Kim brought to the attention of the membership that Redlands PD will be hosting a training session on child prostitution.

- VI. CCIAA Report

Sheila Harbert provided an overview of what has been happening at the CCIAA Board level since the President of IECIAA is automatically a CCIAA Board member. Sheila has been on conference calls with other Board members regarding the cancellation of the 2009 CCIAA Conference, which was slated to be held in San Diego this Fall. There were discussions regarding issues in postponing this year's state conference, such as:

- the seed money given to the regional associations to host the conference
- if there is no state conference, why pay the state dues – are there any consequences
- how does not having the conference impact when IECIAA hosts the state conference
- how does this impact IECIAA's elections (slated for the end of this year)
- what about IECIAA joint hosting with SDCIAA

The next state conference will be held hosted by Northern Valley Crime & Intelligence Analyst Association (NoVCIAA) in September 2010.

## VII. Old BUSINESS

- A. There was further discussion about fund raisers. San Manuel Casino was contacted regarding a donation. IECIAA needs to be a 501c3 in order to receive money from San Manuel Casino. It was stated that SCCIAA is working to get certified as 501c3. When that happens, the money from San Manuel could be sent to them and then given to IECIAA.
- i. There were additional fundraising suggestions:
    1. Partylite fund-raiser – the Association would receive 50% of whatever is sold. Rhonda Maher will be sending out information to each agency.
    2. Improv fund-raiser – the Association would have to sell a minimum of 100 seats to raise money.
    3. A turn-around to Stateline – this suggestion was brought up again
    4. San Diego Brewery Tour – the Association would need to sell an unknown number of seats to raise money. The tour would begin and end in San Diego.
    5. First Aid Kits – Christine (Chino PD intern) will be getting information on selling first aid kits.
    6. Hangar 24 in Redlands
    7. SBSO Ride – June 7

## VIII. New BUSINESS

- A. There was a roundtable discussion with the membership after the presentation:
- i. Welcome to new members – Christine from Chino PD – intern
  - ii. Budget Crisis – Meeting the demands of our agencies is getting more difficult
    1. Omega website has information on grants.
    2. Corona PD lost a volunteer; had 112 layoffs (some were vacant positions) in October 2008; in FY '09 & '10 should not have any layoffs or furloughs
    3. Riverside City – managers will not see any raises or merit increases
    4. Redlands City – furloughs are in place instead of laying off full-time staff; some part-time staff were laid off
    5. Pomona PD – Crime Analyst Annette Fajardo was laid off
  - iii. License Plate Data – is anyone using this data?
    1. Corona searches for partial license plates with this data.
