**General Meeting Minutes
Tuesday, June 30, 2009
Ontario Police Department
9:00 am – 11:30 am**

I. Meeting brought to order at 9:00 am by Vice President – Programs Kim Folkens
Kim Folkens welcomed everyone and requested for everyone to sign the sign-in sheet. Kim gave general housekeeping comments and stated the minutes from the last general meeting were the association website.

II. Board Meeting Minutes
Nothing to report at this time.

III. President's Report
Michelle Smith gave an overview of the IECIAA website. Also noted was upcoming training, including the Excel for Law Enforcement class given by LA CLEAR.

Michelle Smith and Rebecca Gibson discussed briefly the 2011 State Conference. There is a possibility the conference will be a joint conference with the San Diego Crime Analyst/Intelligence Association and IECIAA. Some of the discussion included: by co-hosting the conference, it would put the state conference back on track/schedule; in order for IECIAA to host a conference, we would need to do more fundraising. Also, there was some discussion about a joint conference with IACA in 2011.

IV. Treasurer's Report
Michelle Smith read the treasurer's report and had copies of the report on the back table. Michelle explained the treasury statement balance as of the 6/29/09 was \$851.53. This included the May 27, 2009 bank statement balance of \$812.53, \$150.00 in association income and membership dues, and association expenditures of \$620.00. The expenditures included the renewal of IACA dual membership and Post Office Box rental.

V. Membership Report
Rebecca Gibson reminded the membership that an election/nomination committee needed to be formed for the next Association elections. No other membership report was given at this time.

VI. Programs Report
Kim Folkens reported that the nomination/election committee should be in place by August 2009 for October 2009 elections.

Kim also has been in contact with the LAPD CompStat analyst and has arranged for our association to attend the August 12, 2009 meeting. She suggested those plan on attending, should car pool.

VII. Secretary Report
Bernie Reynolds reported the minutes were now posted online.

VIII. Open Discussion & Roundtable Discussion

Ina Brown (Ontario PD) is now the Inland Empire correspondent for the SCCIAA newsletter. She is requesting any articles or news be sent to her.

There was discussion among the membership on how the current economics is impacting their agencies.

The topic of interns was also discussed.

IX. Presentations

“Chasing the Dots: From One Perspective to Another” Presentation was given by Vice President – Membership Rebecca Gibson (from Riverside Police Department). Rebecca explained in her presentation that “dots are anything and everything.” One of the challenges a Crime Analysts has is to figure out what a dot means to our “customers.” Another challenge is to “connect the dots.” The public now has mechanism to view “dots” on a map through online mapping programs and make more informed decisions. Rebecca also discussed the online mapping solution, CrimeReports.com, used by Riverside PD.

Community Crime Mapping Presentation was given by Treasurer Michelle Smith. Michelle demonstrated how SBSO is using Crimemapping.com. Crimemapping.com is a hosted site by The Omega Group. Also using this mapping solution is Redlands PD, San Bernardino PD and Fontana PD.

Next meeting will be the “field trip” to LAPD’s CompStat meeting on Wednesday, August 12, 2009.
